I do, and I ask God to help and guide me

On these Sundays after Easter, we have been beginning worship with a word of thanks, a thanksgiving for baptism. We give thanks for God's word, the water, and the promise and claim that we are all beloved children of God.

Last month, a few of our children met for First Communion class, and we gathered around the baptismal font to dip a finger in the water and trace the sign of the cross on our foreheads to remember our baptism. I invite you to do the same each time you enter the sanctuary.

And this month, we will witness our confirmands as they "say yes to their baptism." At the affirmation of baptism (confirmation) service, these children of God will say yes to God's promises that were proclaimed in baptism, and they will now communicate their intent to continue in God's covenant.

"Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me."

And then you will be invited to respond, and likewise, publicly promise your support for these siblings in Christ and pray for them in their lives in Christ:

"We do, and we ask God to help and guide us."

I invite you to live into this promise as often as you can, for you are invited to support and pray for everyone, all of the newly baptized, all who have affirmed their baptism, all of God's creation near and far.

Consider these commitments and tend to your own lives of faith. In the next month that is filled with changing seasons and routines—how will you be living among God's faithful people? How will you dedicate time and space to hear God's word and receive Holy Communion? How will you share the good news in what you say and what you do? How will you serve all people, follow Jesus' example, and be a participant and advocate for justice and peace?

Whether you consider these commitments even once in the month ahead, weekly, or daily—remember you are not called to this life of faith on your own. Look around, phone a friend, invite someone to journey with you—and rely on our God who promises to help and guide you, too.

May you be renewed in the promises of baptism, nourished in the meal we share, and equipped for faithful living. May God's love surround you, dear beloved of God, now and always.


Getting to Know Our New Members

Grace Scholarship Funds

The Endowment Committee at Grace Lutheran Church is responsible for administering the Readel Memorial Scholarship Fund and Allen Memorial Scholarship Fund. Both of these scholarships are for post high school education.

The Readel Memorial Scholarship Fund is available to students pursuing a full-time Christian vocation or related areas. The Allen Memorial Scholarship is for students attending an accredited Lutheran institution.

These funds are for active members of Grace Lutheran Church who are in good standing. The money awarded each year depends on the amount available. Monies are to be paid directly to the institution and not to the student or parents.

Applications are available through the Church Office or on the Grace website (on the navigation bar at the top of the website go to education, then scholarships). <u>Scholarship applications for both the Readel and Allen funds are due to the Grace Lutheran Church Office by July 1, 2023.</u>

All scholarship applications are reviewed by the Endowment Committee and voted on during the quarterly meeting in July; payments are made in August.
