



Forever and Ever, Amen

I don't know where my parents want to be buried. To be fair, they don't quite know either. My parents grew up on the north and south sides of Chicago, where they live now isn't where they raised my sisters and me, and they



haven't lived within a half-hour drive of their church community for over thirty years, so the question of where feels complicated. I have made a note though, that my dad would like the Moody Blues and the Beach Boys' music to be played during a visitation. I have perhaps annoyingly asked my parents about burial locations from time to time, always trying to be clear that I ask because a part of my vocation is to be on the other end—asking bereaved families so many questions during funeral planning, and I want to know how to be able to honor their wishes whenever that time arrives. And I ask because I filled out my own notes for funeral planning over eight years ago, when we only had one child and had just created a will, and I had last presented here about the history of Christian funerals and funeral planning at Grace.

I invite you into these conversations, too. Talk with your loved ones about your hopes for what end-of-life care might look like, what you'd prefer as far as burial and/or cremation, find a lawyer for creating or reviewing your own legal documents, let me know if you'd like to be connected to our ELCA Regional Gift Planner if you would like to know more about remembering your church in your estate planning, and reach out to a funeral home to learn more about arrangements that can be made in advance.

And I invite you to join me on **Sunday**, **November 19** after worship in **room 101** to hear a little about the history of Christian funerals, the practice of accompanying loved ones with singing, and the funeral

planning worksheets we have at Grace. Over the years, several people have kept a copy of their funeral service plans in the church office, and lately we've had several more people request these planning sheets. I invite you all to gather to learn more and reach out with any questions.

In November, we begin with a powerful remembrance of all saints, remembering before God all who have died, and then draw near to the end of the church year at the end of the month. Our scripture readings take a turn toward apocalyptic, which means revelation, an uncovering and revealing. How is God being revealed in this changing of seasons, in the remembrance of beloved dead, in the festive meals and gatherings of thanksgiving, in the weary world we are living in, in the anticipation of Jesus' birth and presence and return? I pray God's love and grace are revealed anew for you, as you continue to remember and gather and give thanks and grieve and live among God's faithful people, ever committed to being church together.

We begin November by remembering all of God's saints, those baptized in the past year, those who have died in the past year, and all for whom we grieve, remember, and give thanks to God.

SUNDAY, NOV. 5, ALL SAINTS SUNDAY. You will be invited to share in a time of remembrance and candle lighting. First, a candle will be lit for each person baptized at Grace this past year. Then, those gathered in the sanctuary will be invited to come forward to light a candle in remembrance of family and friends who are now with God eternally. If you are worshipping via YouTube livestream, or the posted worship videos on our website, you are invited to share in this time of remembrance and prayer in your home.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 21. We gather on Thanksgiving Eve Eve for worship at 7 p.m. Join us as we try this new date, a day earlier than in the past and before possible travel, cleaning, meal prepping the day before a holiday. We gather in worship for the great thanksgiving—giving thanks and praise to God and sharing in Holy Communion where all are welcome and all are fed.

Quorum of 50 voting Grace members is needed. Copies of the revised constitution were sent via email on Oct. 10. A limited number of paper copies can be picked up at the Welcome Center in the narthex. Our second voting meeting will be our February annual meeting.
