
Vocational Prayer


Can we allow joy to point us toward a clear understanding of our vocation? The word vocation comes from the Latin word *vocare*, to call. At its root, it's a way of talking about what God is calling us to do. Theologian Frederick Buechner describes vocation as "the place where our deep gladness and the world's great hunger meet." Joy and need help us discern where God is calling us.

In the circle below, or on your own, fill it with things that give you joy, represented in words or images: your talents and passions, people you love, hobbies, beloved places, milestones and celebrations.

Now in a second circle below, or on your own, fill it with needs in your church, community, or around the world that are known to you and seem especially pressing.

Where do these two circles connect? Draw lines connecting where things that give you joy connect to a need. Spend time in silent prayer for God to send you a clear sense of vocation, a sense of where your joy and the world's needs meet.

This March, we continue to gather on Sundays at 9:00 A.M. through March 24 when we wave palm branches and shout hosannas on Palm Passion Sunday, and then enter into Holy Week.

On Maundy Thursday, we remember Jesus' last supper, the night he was betrayed, and consider his new commandment to love one another as Jesus loves. (Enter the Three Days in worship at noon or 7 p.m.)

On **Good Friday**, our hearts are broken open as we hear of Jesus' anointing, meal, prayer. betrayal, denial, crucifixion, and burial. We lament and pray as we behold the cross. (Worship continues at noon & 7 p.m.)

CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATE: MARCH 2024

BUDGET FORUM: A big thank you to the Grace Church members who attended our 2024 Budget Forum on January 28. Andy Bellavia did an excellent job in his presentation of the summary of our 2023 income and expenses. Then he proceeded to explain the detailed manner in which our Finance Committee determined our 2024 budget.

ANNUAL MEETING: With a guorum on Feb. 4 at our annual meeting, we were able to pass very important items. After very intensive work by your church council, we revised our 2018 constitution to meet the required and needed upgrades from the 2019 and 2022 ELCA churchwide assemblies. The changes required two congregational votes. By the approval at our Nov. 12, 2023 and Feb. 4, 2024 meetings, we are now fine until any changes from the 2025 ELCA churchwide assembly may be needed.

We elected our voting members to the June Northern Illinois Synod Assembly. Representing Grace are

GRACE SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS. The Endowment Committee at Grace Lutheran Church is responsible for administering the Readel Memorial Scholarship Fund and Allen Memorial Scholarship Fund. Both of these scholarships are for post high school education.

The Readel Memorial Scholarship Fund is available to students pursuing a full-time Christian vocation or related areas, including continuing education courses, sabbaticals for further study and other educational purposes.

The Allen Memorial Scholarship is for students attending an accredited Lutheran institution. These funds are for active members of Grace Lutheran Church who are in good standing. The money awarded each year depends on the amount available. Monies are to be paid directly to the institution and not to the student or parents. Applications are available through the Church Office or on the Grace website. On the navigation bar at the top go to education, then scholarships. Scholarship applications for both the Readel and Allen funds are due into the Grace Lutheran Church Office by July 1, 2024. All scholarship applications are reviewed by the Endowment Committee and voted on during the

quarterly meeting in July; payments are made in August.

ALLEN SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED IN 2023. The Grace Lutheran Church Endowment Board is proud to have awarded an Allen Scholarship in the amount of \$1,322.79 to Hannah Paulson for 2023.

READEL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED IN 2023. The Grace Lutheran Church Endowment Board awarded Readel Scholarship funds in the amount of \$569.70 for Food Safe Manager education trainings for Grace Lutheran Church members in 2023.
