Sewing Circle 2024 Year-End Update:

Thank you to Grace Sewing Circle members for all your hard work, and thank you to the congregation for sharing your gifts of sheets, fabric, pillow stuffing, batting, yarn, thread and Thrivent Action Team cards. Because of your generosity, our sewing circle was able to help many people this year, both locally to nine nursing homes in the area, plus three other charities, and globally through Lutheran World Relief.

We distributed twice last year: once in July and then in November. We recorded year-end stats as follows:

Locally distributed items include: 212 lap quilts; 51 crocheted blankets; 126 small pillows; 59 neck pillows; 350 walker bags; 152 wheelie bags; 166 cell phone bags; and 260 poly bags.

Lutheran World Relief received 157 quilts from our group last year. Praise God!

Our group works together on creating all of our items for distribution, with several people working on different stages of each item. Some of our members do work at home and others just work during our twice monthly meetings. Some of us do both. Our members "come when they can, leave when they must" and are welcome to do as little

or as much creating as they wish, resulting in a wonderful example of working in community to Share God's Grace.

Our group continues to meet on the first and third Tuesdays of the month from 8:30 a.m. - noon and we always welcome new members.

We have projects for sewers and non-sewers alike, and also kits and other projects that you can do in the comfort of your own home and at your leisure. Come and join us! Any questions, please contact Tammy Hansing or the church office.

People in Need Forum


