

I keep seeing a poem being shared online, “the world is both burning and blooming ...” Look for this poem, hear the author affirm we don’t have to choose, we can see and experience the both/ands of living: “rage and reverence, grief and grace.” I trust you know something of this personal and communal tension from simultaneous beauty and pain, growth and destruction, joy and sorrow.

In these trying days at the start of a new year, don’t look away. Don’t look away from what devastates and don’t lose sight of God’s grace being revealed.

Beloved, we are equipped by ancestors in faith to see and call a thing what it is: evil, harm, injustice, goodness, mercy, redemption. We cling to the promise of a faith that is beyond our comprehension. We long for the day where all is made well and whole. And in the meantime, we are to live out our faith in daily life.

In the words of hymns we sing, we trust that “hope blooms in a weary world” (ELW 726). Or in Gungor’s “Beautiful Things,” we notice how God can make beautiful things out of dust and out of us, for “hope is springing up from this old ground; out of chaos life is being found in You.”

Each year, as we gather on Ash Wednesday, we see dusty, messy signs of both death and life. We remember both that we are dust, and to dust we shall return, and we remember that we are named, claimed, and redeemed by the cross of Christ and the promise of Jesus’ resurrection.

Hold on to these things — the world is not as it is intended to be and God still promises to bring forth life and healing. We are equipped and called to participate in God’s work in the world and have gifts of voice, time, resources, hands and feet to be a part of God’s love made known. Blessings on your faithful witness.

## Columbarium Task Force Update After January 2026 Meeting

The Columbarium Task Force met on January 12, 2026, to review the responses to our two-month churchwide survey regarding interest in Grace Lutheran Church establishing a columbarium on our grounds.

We had a good response from interested Grace members and so we invited our guest, Ralph Wehnnes, chair of the columbarium committee of Shepherd of the Prairie Lutheran Church in Huntley, to share his insights into our next steps. His church recently completed a beautiful columbarium.



We shared a potential location near the northeast corner of our church building and the desire to have a two-sided wall-style columbarium starting with 24 niches. This is similar to the Calvary Catholic Cemetery site.

Ralph was able to give us excellent recommendations to assist in planning for growth and ensuring this

as an easily accessible and meditative spot.

It is important to remember that the columbarium expenses are paid through the purchases of the niches, not through the church's operating budget.

Our next steps are to pursue the local and state permit requirements and solicit bids from area suppliers of columbariums. We will keep you updated.
