CHRISTMAS HAS COME!!!!.....By Pastor Ken Gibson

For a short time now we have been singing, praying, and desiring that Christmas would come. We have sung O' Come O' Come Emanuel. We have spoken words of longing for the light that overcomes all darkness to come again so that we might celebrate the birth of the "Savior tis Christ the Lord." (Luke2:11) Now we are in Christmas, we have celebrated again the greatest birth of all time. A birth that was heralded by angels to shepherds who kept watch o'er their flocks by night. Yes, Christmas has come! It had taken a serious long time for the first advent to be brought to conclusion. How long had the people waited for this One to come and how might the reality of this amazing advent event effect the world as it was known? We only have four short weeks of Advent in our calendar, yet I wonder if we could use more? In a sermon given by Luther on Christmas day in 1530 Luther began his lengthy message, (if you think my sermons are long sometimes, read some of Dr. Martins) with the following opening words;

"You have heard today the story from the Gospel of St. Luke of how it came to pass that our Lord Christ was born and then also the message of the angel, who announced who the boy was who was born. Now we shall go on and take up the message of the angel. So, for today you have heard only that the child was born and that this is the Lord and Savior. Thus, we spoke of the story, how it unfolded, and who the persons in it were."

Luther then goes on to discuss in many pages what our role is to be next. Just like then, I think this is still the message that we should consider as well. In short, we know the story. We know the persons that make the story possible. Yet, do we take the next step? For the next step is one of faith. It is up to us to believe and to be so moved by this event that we are compelled to live out our lives sharing in the truth of who this one is. Think of all the Christmas cards and crafted images we have that simply say on them "Believe". This story in all its simplicity is indeed the greatest story ever told. Not even a Hallmark Movie can exceed its glory.

So, I wonder, did you catch a hint in the opening remarks that Luther sees us to be about the work of taking up the work of the angel? He states in his second sentence; "Now we shall go on and take up the message of the angel." We are to be the proclaimers of this good news. We are to be the angels of our time. Now you might be thinking; "I really don't see myself as very angelic." But in truth we are to be about such work. And being a little more angelic, currently, is without a doubt, something the whole world could and should embrace. So, as we sing again the great Hymns we long to sing, let us hear these words and live out our Christmas identity. For we have heard, and we do sing of; Angels We Have Heard on High, ELW 289 and of That Boy-Child of Mary ELW 293 and of The First Noel ELW 300. But let us not forget hymn #290 ELW; and let it be our "angel work' here and now. GO TELL IT ON THE MOUNTAIN. Over the hills and everywhere. Sing if you like, its ok, it is our role and yes, we do sing with "Angelic" voices one and all!

Now please let me conclude with a big THANK YOU to so many of you who have sent a card or offered a gift to me and Yvonne over this season. Your love reflects the angel lights and voices you truly are.

I finally had a chance to watch the latest documentary on Mister Rogers and am struck by the legacy formed by his simple, straightforward, honest, and compassionate communication. I have long appreciated Mister Rogers and his neighborhood, apparently as a child I once ran up to the TV in tears to say goodbye. And since my two sisters share the same birthdate 5 years apart, I felt special knowing that I shared the same birthdate with Mister Rogers. Now, I occasionally hear similar themes and lessons when my own kids watch the new Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood.

In these days of eager anticipation for celebrating Jesus' birth at Christmas and then the quick turn towards the start of the New Year, here are a few words from Mr. Rogers (from *The World According to Mister Rogers: Important Things*).

"Often when you think you're at the end of something, you're at the beginning of something else. I've felt that many times. My hope for all of us is that "the miles we go before we sleep" will be filled with all the feelings that come from deep caring - delight, sadness, joy, wisdom - and that in all the endings of our life, we will be able to see the new beginnings." -Mister Rogers

I wish you God's peace that surpasses understanding, courage for all the feelings, comfort in grieving, delight in rejoicing, and the ability to see new beginnings. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!


