SEEING LENT AS A JOURNEY.....by Pastor Ken Gibson

“Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan (river) and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil.”

The statement above points us back to the first Lent when Jesus went into the wilderness alone and began to prepare himself for the ministry that awaited. Jesus began his ministry and, as we know, made the journey that lead him to the cross.

In keeping with that thought, I would like us to consider our journey through Lent. The beauty of the church calendar is that it is ever inviting us to take part in the process. It may seem like we just finished Advent, Christmas and are welcoming the light of Epiphany (and, of course, that’s true), but very quickly we are invited to consider a Lenten journey, a time of prayer and deep reflection, a time for listening to God and giving ourselves over to some God time, some silent time.

Ask yourself; *“When was the last time I was able to sit and pray in silence? When was it that I last prayed to God? When is it that I pause for a specific time and put everything else aside and just prayed? When was my last alone time with God?”*

During the upcoming season of Lent, we will once again offer mid-week Lenten services at 12:00 p.m. and this year starting at 6:30 p.m. each Wednesday. These offerings are outside of our weekly Sunday offerings, and I encourage you to attend as many of these Wednesday offerings as you are able. Although we only offered the Holden Evening Prayer one time this past Advent, we will be offering these each Wednesday during Lent with a focus on the following text from Philippians 2:5-11.

Philippians 2:5-11

5 Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, 7 but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, 8 he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death— even death on a cross. 9 Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, 10 so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

This text and what we will offer each week in Lent will guide us to the place Jesus is headed. We will journey to Holy week and recall the revelation of God’s never-ending grace as Jesus empties himself and becomes obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross.

Our salvation is reveled to us in this salvific act. In response to this gift, I ask you, again, to consider seeing Lent as a journey of reflection into what the first Lent and the first Holy Week mean for you.

PRAYERS.....by Pastor Amanda

Last year I took an online class exploring Celtic Spirituality: Experiencing God in the Everyday, where I studied and wrote different kinds of prayers as a part of the course. One of the prayer types is called the “Long, Wandering Prayer” a recognition of an ongoing and unending conversation with God, praying as one goes.

Someone once told me that prayers do not only consist of the words between “Dear God” and “Amen,” so I already had a strong connection to this “Long, Wandering Prayer” as the ongoing conversation one has with God. I trust that God hears my prayers and ongoing thoughts, and that the Spirit indeed intercedes for us when we cannot find the words to pray. Even still, in the task of writing a “Long, Wandering Prayer” I felt a renewed awareness of God’s presence.

The assignment was to write a prayer for a journey you take regularly - your morning routine, or your commute to work, your typical route to the grocery store, or a walking path you frequent. Then you write down some words as a prayer for that journey. The format may wander, the prayer may feel long; yet the practice invited me to pay closer attention to a particular part of my day that can otherwise fall into unnoticed routine.

This February, I invite you to try praying in a new way and see how you too might experience a renewed awareness of God’s presence. Perhaps you’ll try writing your own “long, wandering prayer” for a habitual part of your daily journey. Maybe you’ll try praying at a different time of day than you usually do. Maybe you’ll pray the Lord’s Prayer on the weekdays in addition to during worship. Maybe you don’t usually pray at all and will give it a try sometime this month, for there is no right or wrong way to pray to God.

I hope that this faith practice of prayer may be a source of strength and renewal to you. Thanks be to God who is always with us on the long, wandering journey of life; may God’s presence continue to be revealed to you.
