PATTERNS, CHAOS AND ACTIVE HOPE.....by Pastor John Cunningham

We are used to patterns in life. Often there is a beginning, a middle and an ending. Often there's repetition. We get so accustomed to the patterns that we take them for granted.

Daily routines are examples. So are traditions. Fourth of July is fireworks and parades. Thanksgiving is turkey with family and friends.

It's no exaggeration to say that just about all of our familiar patterns of life have been disrupted by COVID-19! The pandemic has caused changes that often are difficult, confusing, and painful. Suddenly what was routine can be life-threatening. We have experienced (or seen) work and study transformed. We feel confined and separated from others.

Worship, too, is nothing like it used to be. And now we are coming to Christmas. What will that be like?

At Grace, worship leaders have been working hard to provide weekly and special worship services. You will notice plans for Advent and Christmas in this newsletter. Meanwhile the reopening team has presented information to the Council, for a plan for safely reopening our building again.

But we also know that the pandemic is now spreading more. We don't know how much better or worse it will get until finally, sufficient vaccines are available. As a result, some of the plans made now may have to be changed or put on hold. And that can happen with very short notice.

Advent is a time for hope. It is not a time for giving up, but for active waiting (doing what we can while we wait) and alert watching for opportunities. We can be encouraged by the many Bible references of God's caring presence with people in all kinds of times. There is an exodus from slavery, through a wilderness to the promised land. There is a return from exile. God was with the people all along the way.

Christmas is all about a gift from God who is Emmanuel ("God with us"), a Savior who brings healing and wholeness and life even beyond death. It is good news of great joy for all people. What looked like a baby in a manger, or later, a man on a cross, was actually something much more!

As we watch and listen for God, trusting God's ever-present care in these difficult times, we may well find a deeper appreciation for what really matters in life. In the days ahead, as much as patterns and traditions may be disrupted, we can continue to hope, to worship, to live faithfully. In a different worship setting, I would often hear a worship leader, at the end of the prepared petitions for the Prayers of the People, ask “for what else do the people of God pray?” Then people in the worshipping community would take turns sharing different prayer petitions, speaking the prayers of their hearts out loud for the assembly to share in prayer to God.

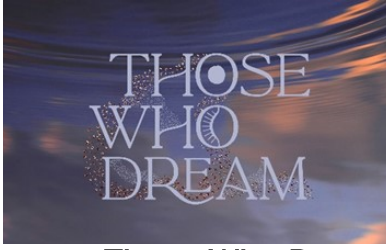

We have created a website, www.GraceCFS.org, which provides direct links to ways to give to our ministry partners. Each way of giving looks a little bit different, but it is all clearly outlined on the website.

You may support FHPC by purchasing items from their Amazon wish list with the items being delivered directly to the Clinic. Turning Point has requested gift cards from local stores which they will share with their families. Donations to ELCA Good Gifts can be made directly from their website with an even wider variety of options available than in previous years.

WORSHIP THIS DECEMBER



We invite you to journey together around the theme “Those Who Dream” through the seasons of Advent and Christmas through Epiphany. Beginning with worship on the first Sunday of Advent, November 29, we’ll hear the word of God, pray, and sing of God’s good news this season.

Those Who Dream *keep awake, prepare the way, sow joy, and are not alone.*

Sunday morning worship services will continue to be available online through our website, and soon livestreamed through Grace’s YouTube channel. We hope you will keep checking Grace’s website or Facebook to find each weekend worship service, as well as subscribe to the new [Grace Lutheran Church YouTube Channel](#) to receive notifications for livestreamed services. We will also plan to continue FM radio transmission to the parking lot, and dependent on volunteers and weather, communion elements will be available for pick up before Sunday worship at 9 A.M.

Drive-Thru Communion Pick-Up. On Sunday, **December 6**, you are invited to drive-thru Grace’s parking lot from 10-11 A.M. to pick up consecrated Holy Communion elements from the morning worship service. Home Communion ministers are also invited to pick up home communion kits on this 1st Sunday of the month for delivery.

Daily Devotional. This season we invite you to share in a daily devotional. A printed booklet was available during November’s Drive-Thru drop-off and pick-up event, and additional copies are still available for pick up in the box in front of the main entrance. Wednesday Midweek worship services will be around half an hour, each Wednesday evening at 7 P.M. on Zoom on December 2, 9, 15, 23. We will gather for prayer and contemplative reflection on scripture, poetry, and art. Please watch for the Zoom link in a *Grace Constant Contact* email.
