This fall, we hope you'll share in worship on **Sundays** at **9 a.m.** in the sanctuary, via <u>YouTube livestream</u> or the posted worship videos on our website.

ALL SAINTS SUNDAY. At the beginning of November, we gather for worship on Sunday, **Nov. 6** on **All Saints Sunday**. Our time shared in worshipping God includes a time of candle lighting and reflection. First, a candle will be lit for each person baptized at Grace this past year. Then, those gathered in the sanctuary will be invited to come forward to light a candle in remembrance of family and friends who are now with God eternally. If you are worshipping via the livestream or worship video, you are invited to share in this time of remembrance and prayer in your home.

CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY. On Nov. 20, we mark the end of the liturgical calendar year on Christ the King Sunday. Then on Wednesday, Nov. 23, you are invited to worship at 7 p.m. on Thanksgiving Eve.

On Sunday, **Nov. 27**, we begin the season of Advent, a time of hopeful waiting, watching, and preparing for the good news of Jesus' birth.

Wednesday, **Nov. 30, 7 - 7:30 p.m.**, will be the first of four **Advent Midweek Gatherings**, and we'll meet in the sanctuary on this first Wednesday in Advent for an Advent hymn sing. Save the dates for additional half hour midweek gatherings on **Dec. 7, 14, and 21**.

Multiple generations sat in awe in the Grace Lutheran pews on Sunday, Oct. 16 as artist and pastor Paul Oman depicted the entire service through his artwork titled, "Jesus Calming the Storm" on a 54" x 60" canvas.

As Paul began painting, young children could be heard asking their parents what they think the image might be. About 30 minutes into the service, Paul performed something unique with the canvas as the congregation then too, saw his vision. Parents and grandparents could be heard explaining the meaning behind the painting of Jesus with his disciples.

"I thought it was reflective of our current world situations," said Fay Wilson. "It was not just a focus on our own personal struggles."

Nov. 6 Forum To Explain Grace's **Hearing Assist Devices**

There are multiple reasons why people might have difficulty understanding one or more of the worship leaders. Since being able to hear everyone without straining is integral to a meaningful worship experience, Grace offers listening assist devices for anyone to use. They are small, batterypowered units that work with or without hearing aids.

Stav in the sanctuary after service on Nov. 6, and Andy Bellavia, himself a hearing aid wearer, will show the various ways one can use Grace's listening devices. If you have hearing aids and don't already know if they have a "T-Coil," before the forum, ask your audiologist and learn how to switch it on.
